The Editorial Office invites interested authors to contribute to this fascinating volume by submitting manuscripts covering original and independent research in different aspects of **international law based on a comparative research design**. Submission deadline is 30th August 2023.

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

1. The Editors request all authors to indicate their academic qualifications and professional status as well as email addresses. An abstract of not more than 200 words should be provided at the beginning of an article.
2. Each article should be submitted in UK English as a Word document written in single-spaced 13-point Garamond (Footnotes in 10 points size and single-spaced Book Antiqua) through shirimacastro@makumira.ac.tz with a copy sent via ruhangisa123@gmail.com
3. All notes should appear as footnotes. Full citations must be provided in accordance with the Oxford System for the Citation of

Legal Authorities (OSCOLA) available online or on demand from the Editorial Office.

4. Suggested length of submissions should be between 8000 and 10000 words; case comments and book reviews between 3000 and 5000 words; and Book Squabs (Short Notes on new books) between 1000 and 3000 words.
5. It is the author's responsibility to ensure that where copyright materials are included within an article the permission of the copyright holder has been obtained. Confirmation of this should be provided in writing to the Editorial Office.
6. Articles must not simply summarize the existing literature on a particular topic but must add a new dimension to the current debate or the author's own informed conclusion and proposition. All quotations should be indented to half an inch on both sides and should be in 10-point Garamond.

Note: After passing an initial assessment by the Editors and the Editorial Board, all manuscripts will be sent to two anonymous peer reviewers whose opinions on the suitability of the manuscript for publication is final. The Editorial Committee reserves the right to ensure the manuscript is aligned with the house style and is free from ambiguities.
